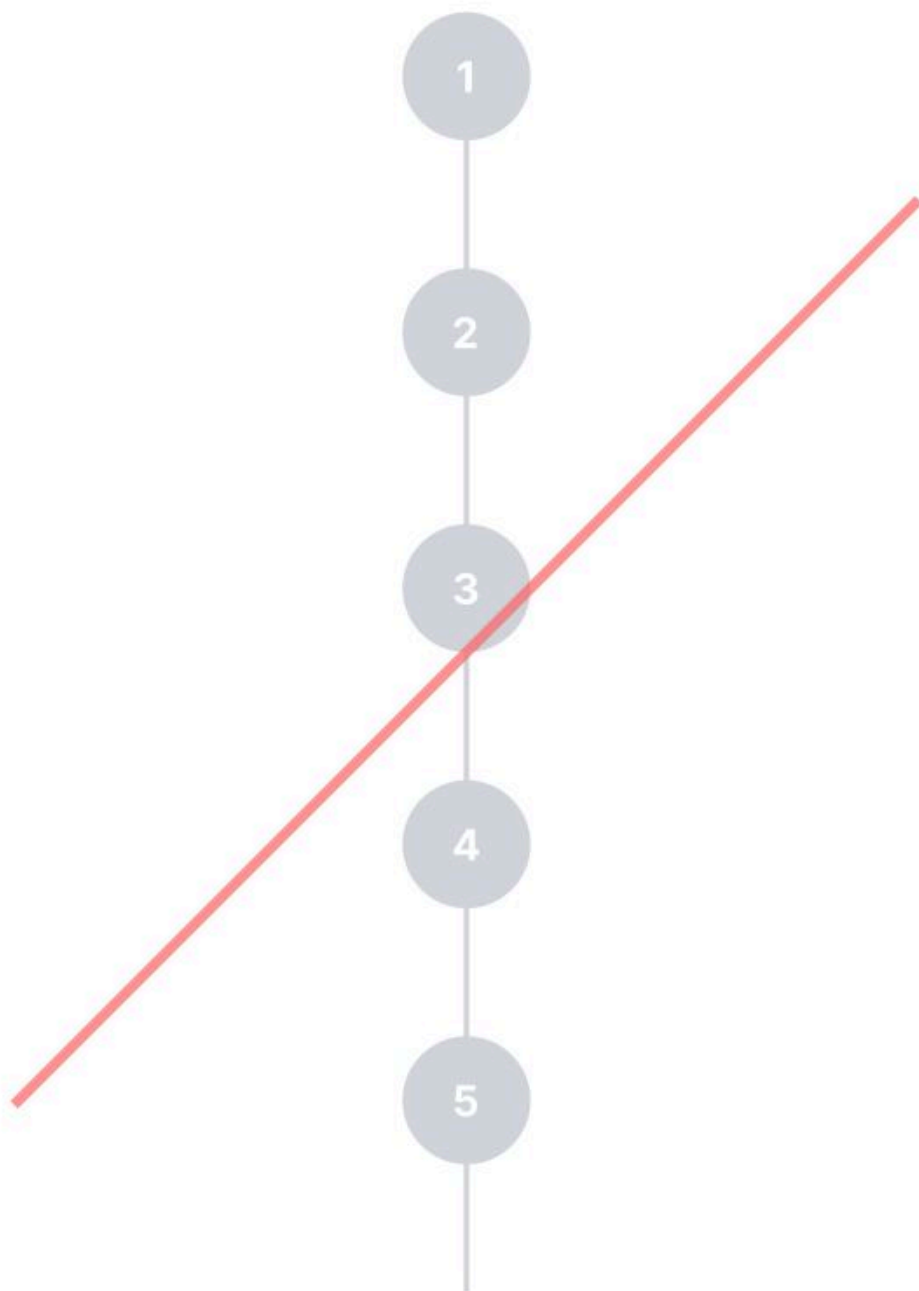

OLD MODEL

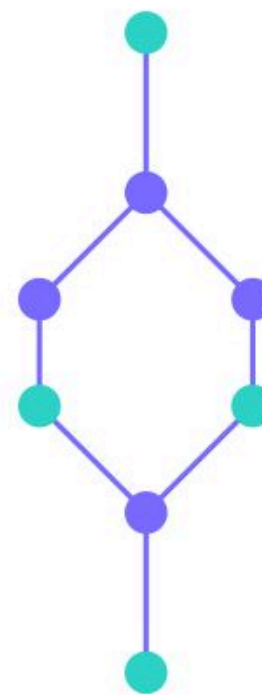
## Linear Path

# The Hidden Structure of Being Stuck

# Why Most Career Advice Fails

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Most career advice is built on an outdated assumption: that careers are stable enough to plan in advance.

Advice like “follow your passion,” “pick a path,” or “commit early” assumes that the destination is known, and your job is simply to choose it. But in reality, you don’t have enough information yet; about yourself, about the market, or about how roles actually work in practice.

That’s why this advice often creates more pressure than progress. It pushes you to make decisions before you’ve had the chance to explore, test, and gather real signals. In a non-linear world, clarity doesn’t come from deciding early. It comes from interacting with the system and learning as you go.

# 01

## Discover

Understand your strengths, values, and how you work best.

*What this means: Not what you're good at on paper—but how you actually operate.*

### ACTION STEPS

- 1 Reflect on past experiences
- 2 Identify what energises vs drains you
- 3 Write down your strengths

# 02

## Envision

Explore industries, roles, and future opportunities.

*What this means: Your job is not to decide—it's to expand what's possible.*

### ACTION STEPS

- 1 Research 3 career paths
- 2 Speak to people in those roles
- 3 Stay open

# 03

## Explore

Test ideas through real-world exposure.

*What this means: This is where thinking stops—and learning begins.*

### ACTION STEPS

- 1 Have 2–3 conversations
- 2 Try a small project
- 3 Observe or shadow

# 04

## Build

Develop skills and career capital.

*What this means: This is how you create momentum  
—even without clarity.*

### ACTION STEPS

- 1 Start a project
- 2 Learn a relevant skill
- 3 Document progress

# 05

## Position

Articulate your value clearly.

*What this means: People don't respond to potential. They respond to clarity.*

### ACTION STEPS

- 1 Write a short career narrative
- 2 Update LinkedIn
- 3 Practice explaining your path

# What We See Working With Students

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Working with students, the pattern is consistent. Most people wait for clarity before they act. They try to think their way into the right decision, hoping that with enough research or reflection, the answer will become obvious.

But the students who make progress do the opposite. They act earlier, test more, and treat each step as a way to gather information. Instead of asking “What should I do?”, they ask “What can I learn from this?” Over time, this compounds. Small experiments lead to better signals. Better signals lead to stronger decisions. And what looks like confidence from the outside is often just the result of having run more experiments than everyone else.

# Why This Approach Works

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The Career Design Loop works because it aligns with how clarity is actually built.

Clarity is not something you arrive at through thinking alone. It is a by product of action, feedback, and reflection. When you test ideas, you generate real-world signals, what you enjoy, where you perform well, what creates momentum. That information simply doesn't exist until you create it.

Over time, this shifts everything. You move from guessing to learning, from reacting to building, from uncertainty to direction. Not because you found the "right" answer but because you developed a process that consistently moves you closer to it.
